

**“2+2” Articulation Agreement between
SUNY Broome Associate of Science (A.S.) Business Administration and
SUNY New Paltz Bachelor of Science (B.S.) in Business (Accounting, Finance, General Business,
International Business, Marketing, Management, Entrepreneurship, Business Analytics)**

The purposes of this agreement are:

1. To attract qualified students to SUNY Broome and SUNY New Paltz;
2. To facilitate the effective transition of transfer students holding the A.S. in Business Administration from SUNY Broome to parallel BS programs at SUNY New Paltz;
3. To enable students to complete the two degrees in four years;
4. To foster continuous communication between the respective academic departments/schools, facilitate curriculum changes when appropriate, and provide accurate and timely advisement for interested students.

Terms of the agreement

SUNY New Paltz agrees to accept all students who have earned the Associate of Science (A.S.) in Business Administration from SUNY Broome with full junior standing when transferring to the Bachelor of Science (B.S.) in a business major in accordance with the following terms.

New Paltz will:

1. Accept up to 70 academic credits toward the baccalaureate degree upon award of the associate degree from SUNY Broome with a cumulative GPA of 2.75 or higher.
2. Provide A.S. degree holders with an individual transfer credit evaluation and assessment of credits completed and credits still needed to meet all B.S. degree and graduation requirements (e.g. writing intensive and diversity courses).
3. Grant credit toward courses in the School of Business as outlined in Appendix A. In accordance with general college policy, one-half of the major must be completed at New Paltz.
4. Provide the opportunity to earn the baccalaureate degree in a parallel program in no more than four additional semesters of successful, planned full-time study or part-time equivalent.
5. Guarantee that SUNY Broome students accepted in transfer under the terms of this agreement will also be subject to any special requirements applicable to students who enrolled at SUNY New Paltz as freshmen.

This agreement commences on the date of its signing and shall remain in effect until terminated by either college. The content of the agreement will be reviewed on a periodic basis and updated as curricular changes are made at both colleges. Both colleges will notify each other when such changes are made.
