BELLEVUE UNIVERSITY

AND

SUNY BROOME COMMUNITY COLLEGE ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

Bellevue University located at 1000 Galvin Road South, Bellevue, NE 68005, and SUNY Broome Community College, believes that cooperative programs benefit the community, employers, and students in their regions. It allows smooth transition for students transferring between institutions and maximizes allowable transfer of credit. Therefore, Bellevue University and SUNY Broome Community College are entering into the following agreement for articulation.

Bellevue University agrees that if a student satisfactorily graduates from the Business Information Management A.A.S and presents the appropriate transcript documentation of such to the Registrar of Bellevue University, he/she:

- 1. Will receive full recognition of that degree towards the completion of a Bachelor's degree at Bellevue University. Students who hold an associate degree will have no additional general education core curriculum requirements to meet, but must satisfy the Kirkpatrick Signature Series requirement.
- 2. Will be required to complete at least 30 credit hours of in-residence courses at Bellevue University to be eligible to earn a Bachelor degree.
- 3. Transfer in good standing from the last institution of higher education attended. No individual course will be accepted for transfer when it carries a grade of "C-". Associate and bachelor's degrees; however, are transferred in full.

Note: To satisfy minimum residency degree requirements, transfer students must complete a minimum of 30 hours inresidence at Bellevue University, including at least 12 hours in upper-level courses in each of their major areas (except for Business Administration and Accounting majors that require 21 upper-level hours. Accelerated cohort programs exceed residency requirement).

- 4. Such a student will be awarded a Bachelor's degree when all graduation requirements have been met, such as:
 - a. Requirements in the major course of study as stated in the University Catalog.
 - b. Required total credit hours to complete the degree as stated in the University Catalog.
 - c. All other graduation requirements, as stated in the University Catalog, including those pertaining to standards of progress, upper division hours, hours in residence, demonstration of specific competencies, and articulated core where relevant.

Accreditation

Bellevue University and SUNY Broome Community College will ensure that they maintain accreditation with the appropriate regional accrediting body and ensure that all operations will be maintained within accreditation requirements of the two institutions.

Provision for Program Review

Recognizing that changes in curricula and course content are inevitable, each institution agrees to discuss with the other institution all curriculum changes affecting this agreement before implementation.

The appropriate person at SUNY Broome Community College and the Articulation Manager at Bellevue University will be designated as contact persons and coordinators of this transfer agreement. Both agree to act as agents responsible for implementing this agreement, identifying and incorporating any changes into subsequent agreements, communicating changes

to prospective faculty members, advisors, counselors, and others to whom the information is pertinent, and for conducting a period review of this agreement.

Duration and Termination of Agreement

Bellevue University and SUNY Broome Community College agree that this agreement shall be in force from the date of the signing of the agreement and shall remain in force until modified or terminated in writing, following reasonable and mutual discussion by representatives of the two institutions.
