

ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

BETWEEN

State University of New York College of Technology at Delhi (SUNY Delhi) and

SUNY Broome Community College Effective Date Fall 2022

SUNY Delhi agrees to articulate with SUNY Broome Community College by providing opportunities for appropriately qualified students to complete the Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA) degrees in Hotel and Restaurant Management, Event Management, or Culinary Arts Management online or on the SUNY Delhi campus.

While admission to SUNY Delhi is competitive, students satisfying the requirements outlined below will be accepted with full junior status. Courses in the corresponding tables represent directly articulated credit. Additional credits may be transferred in with a total not to exceed 90 credits. Students must complete a minimum of 45 upper division credits as well as SUNY's General Education requirements to earn a bachelor's degree. Students enrolling through this agreement must have:

- 1. An associate degree in a related field from an accredited institution;
- 2. Completed the pathway courses outlined below; and,
- 3. A cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher.

This articulation is based on the following agreements:

- A. SUNY Delhi shall provide financial aid support to matriculated students who qualify;
- B. Interested students must submit an application for admission, along with official college transcripts as required by the Enrollment Services Office at SUNY Delhi.
- C. SUNY Delhi advisors will assume responsibility for advising students who are covered by this agreement. SUNY Delhi DegreeWorks and curriculum information sheets will be used as the mechanism for communicating degree requirements to students.
- D. The Dean of the School of Business and Hospitality Management, Dr. David Brower and Director of Undergraduate Admissions, Joshua Gregory, will be the designated contact persons and coordinators of this agreement for SUNY Delhi. Michael Stamets will be the designated contact person for SUNY Broome Community College. Both parties agree to act as agents responsible for implementing this agreement, identifying and incorporating any changes into subsequent agreements, communicate changes to prospective faculty members, advisors, counselors, and others to whom the information is pertinent.
- E. Should either party desire to terminate this articulation agreement, notification shall be given to the other party in writing not less than six (6) months prior to the proposed date of termination.
- F. SUNY Delhi will supply SUNY Broome Community College with promotional and informational literature, which shall be used to assist students, faculty, and staff.

Reverse Transfer:

Whenever possible, SUNY Delhi will encourage students entering the University under this agreement, who have transferred from SUNY Broome Community College without a degree, to attempt to complete the previous degree program. Reverse transfer allows the student to transfer any credits earned at SUNY Delhi back to SUNY Broome Community College, by which the SUNY Delhi credits in combination with the credit earned at SUNY Broome Community College are evaluated to determine if courses completed satisfy SUNY Broome Community College degree requirements for awarding an associate's degree.
