"2+2" Articulation Agreement between SUNY Broome Associate of Science (A.S.) in Business Administration and University at Buffalo School of Management Bachelor of Science (B.S.) in Business Administration

The purposes of this agreement are:

- 1. To attract qualified students to SUNY Broome Business Programs Department and University at Buffalo, School of Management (SOM);
- To facilitate the effective transition of transfer students holding an A.S. in Business Administration from SUNY Broome to University at Buffalo, School of Management's Bachelor of Science B.S. in Business Administration;
- 3. To enable students to complete the two degrees in four years;
- To foster continuous communication between the respective academic departments/schools, facilitate curriculum changes when appropriate, and provide accurate and timely advisement for interested students.

Terms of the Agreement

University at Buffalo, School of Management agrees to accept all students who have earned the Associate of Science (A.S.) in Business Administration from SUNY Broome with full junior standing when transferring to the Bachelor of Science (B.S.) in a Business Administration with the following terms.

University at Buffalo, School of Management will:

- 1. Accept up to 64 academic credits toward the baccalaureate degree upon award of the associate degree from SUNY Broome with a cumulative GPA of 2.50 or higher as well as a prerequisite course GPA of 2.50 or higher.
- Provide A.S. degree holders with an individualized transfer credit evaluation and assessment of credits completed and credits still needed to meet all B.S. degree and graduation requirements (e.g. psychology, arts, writing intensive, diversity courses, etc).
- Grant credit toward courses in the School of Management as outlined in Appendix A. In accordance with general college policy, one-half of the major must be completed at SUNY Broome and one-half from University at Buffalo.
- 4. Provide the opportunity to earn the baccalaureate degree in Business Administration in no more than four additional semesters of successful, planned full-time study or part-time equivalent.
- 5. Guarantee that SUNY Broome students accepted in transfer under the terms of this agreement will also be subject to any special requirements applicable to students who enrolled at University at Buffalo School of Management as freshmen.

This agreement commences on the date of its signing and shall remain in effect until terminated by either institution. The content of the agreement will be reviewed every 5 years and updated as curricular changes are made at both institutions. Both institutions will notify each other when such changes are made.

2. Students must take BUS 115 and BIT 200 at SUNY Broom to satisfy MGQ 201.

3. MAT 131 at UB is only required if students do not complete MAT 146 at SUNY Broome.

4. Students must take HIS 130 or HIS 131 at SUNY Broome to satisfy the Diversity in the US requirement at UB.

5. Students must take ENG 220 at SUNY Broome to satisfy Humantles and apply to UB Pathways requirement.

6. Students must take HIS 116, 114 or 141 In order to satisfy Other World Civ and apply to UB Pathways requirement.
