

## **TRANSFER ARTICULATION AGREEMENT**

## BROOME COMMUNITY COLLEGE AND THE UNIVERSITY AT ALBANY

This transfer articulation agreement is the result of thoughtful cooperation between the faculty and staff of the University at Albany and Broome Community College.

Academic programs at Broome Community College provide strong preparation for and ready access to baccalaureate programs at the University at Albany. Therefore, we have developed an agreement with Broome Community College that will provide the maximum number of transfer credits applied to a select bachelor degree program at the University at Albany. We strongly believe that many students in a two-year program of study at Broome Community College will benefit from the information, guidance, and transfer course equivalencies this agreement provides.

The University at Albany is delighted to continue our close relationship with Broome Community College and we are proud to offer each student the opportunity to earn both an Associate's degree and baccalaureate degree within the State University of New York system.

The attached University at Albany and Broome Community College transfer equivalency table represents the required and suggested elective courses that are similar and parallel to those completed by degree-seeking students at the University at Albany. Broome Community College students who complete the program as outlined in these arrays with completing courses with a grade of a C- or better, will be awarded full transfer credit and afforded the opportunity to complete the Bachelor's degree in four additional semesters of study following admission to UAlbany. Students cannot transfer in any grades of D. However, except for the University's writing requirements which a grade of C or higher or S is required, transfer work graded D in a course that applies to one or more of the University's General Education requirements may be applied toward fulfilling the requirements even if a student receives no graduation credit for the course. Transfer students who have earned an Associate of Arts (A.A.) or an Associate of

State University of New York

Science (A.S.) degree from a SUNY state-operated campus or SUNY community college shall be considered to have completed all SUNY-wide General Education requirements at UAlbany. The "Challenges for the 21<sup>st</sup> Century" requirement will not be waived by an A.A. or A.S. degree.

Broome Community College students pursuing programs that do not conform to those specified herein will be considered for admission on an individual basis. The transfer course equivalency tables in this agreement will be amended or expanded with mutual consent through an annual review by both institutions.

This transfer agreement links Broome Community College's Business Administration A.S. program to the University at Albany's Business Administration B.S. program. Requirements for the graduates of the Broome Community College's Business Administration A.S. program to be accepted into the University at Albany's Business Administration B.S. are the following:

- Students have a final cumulative GPA of 3.25 or higher and have completed elsewhere a minimum of four of the designated admission core courses with at least a 3.00 average prior to matriculation.
  - For matriculation Fall 2024 and before, a cumulative GPA of 3.00 will be accepted.

(1) Calculus is required at UAlbany, students should take calculus at BCC to be prepared for more advanced math at UA.

(2) BUS 100 and 101 at BCC must be taken to earn credit for BACC 211 at UA. BACC 211 is a requirement at UA.

(3) Business Law is required at UAlbany. Students must take BUS 118 and BUS 120W at BCC to earn Business law credit at UA. Advisors please advise to take BUS 120W instead of BUS 258.

(4) BLAW 220 at UAlbany is part of the major requirements, not a marketing elective. If a student does not take BUS 120W, they will still have to take BLAW 220 to fulfill major requirements.

(5) Students must have completed a total of at least 32 degree applicable credits by the end of the spring semester preceding their summer or fall admission to the University, or by the end of the fall semester preceding their spring admission to the University. They must also have a final cumulative GPA of 3.25 or higher and have completed elsewhere a minimum of four of the designated admission core courses with at least a 3.00 average prior to matriculation. – However, matriculation Fall 2024 and earlier, overall GPA 3.00 will be accepted.

A transfer student admitted to the University at Albany who has completed his/her A.A. or A.S. degree will be given credit for meeting SUNY's General Education requirements. The "Challenges for the 21<sup>st</sup> Century" requirement will not be waived by an A.A. or A.S. degree.
