President's Message

Dear Former Hornet:

As an alumnus, you might recall that our mascot has been a hornet almost since the inception of the college in 1946. In our Hornet's Nest (Baldwin Gym), our mascot was once one of the "winningest" throughout all of college

athletics. Well, you are going to see a lot more of our hornet now, as your alma mater transforms into SUNY Broome Community College. SUNY Broome Community College became our formal name by a vote of the trustees at the June 2013 meeting.

Just like the College, our hornet is a bold symbol of historic success which jumps off the page any time you see it. In rebranding BCC into SUNY Broome, we have sought to raise the visibility of our academic excellence within the Southern Tier, across New York and around the world. Our hornet will be helping us with this rebranding effort. You can see our new look on page 17.

Beginning in 1946 as the NY State Institute of Applied Arts & Sciences, the College has changed its name no less than 5 times. Now the new moniker of SUNY Broome will coincide with the transformation to a residential institution when next summer we open our new Student Village complex which will house 336 students and a full-time director. Throughout the campus and community people are pleased with this development at the college.

I know that not all of you will be excited about these major changes to your alma mater. Like you, I graduated from a commuter community college and I had an outstanding experience while there, subsequently faring spectacularly well in both my further studies and career. So why, you might ask, does my beloved Broome Tech or BCC need to change its name yet again and add residence halls to its successful operating model?

As for our name change, the trend to emphasize the name of colleges and universities has swept the nation over the past 20 years or so. Several of our SUNY sister colleges have done the same, now emphasizing SUNY in the fore of their names. SUNY itself has an incredibly strong national and international brand of academic excellence that we at Broome should take advantage of.

As for housing, much of our competition within SUNY now has residence halls on campus and are recruiting away good students from us as a result. By next fall, fully 25 of the 30 SUNY community colleges will have residence halls. Surprised? I was. Consequently, Broome County students are leaving the area to have a residential college experience at other institutions. Why not offer our outstanding academic programs along with that live-in experience that so many college students crave? Further, when a student does leave the county to attend another community college in New York, Broome County has to pay twice for that student to attend college. So the more students who study within county, the more the county saves. In addition, college housing also has proven to be good economic development for the communities in which projects are located. SUNY Broome has a positive impact on

redeveloping the local economy. Students who attend community colleges tend to remain in that region for work, for raising families and for starting businesses, thus housing programs tend to add to that dynamic by attracting students to the region from further away and by keeping local students local if they seek a college residence experience. Not to mention another critical rationale for student housing - residential students have the best track record for college completion.



In addition to housing, other capital projects are also taking place across campus. Our brand new Natural Science Center was open for the Fall 2013 semester. You will see and hear more about this magnificent building the Spring edition of *BROOME*. We also began a major facelift and interior upgrade to the Wales Building which will be completed this winter. So, by next fall, the entire face of the campus will be new, as our Student Village complex will also be located near the front of campus while the new Science Center will be the prominent feature, along with Decker, as you enter the main parking lot. The only remaining recognizable feature from the old BCC will be 901 Front Street and it will come down during the summer of 2015. We are currently using it as swing space for the Wales renovation and for temporary construction offices for the housing project. I invite you to come by in the future to see your truly reborn alma mater: SUNY Broome Community College!

Thank you so very much for your continued support! We have among the best track records of alumni support for all community colleges nationally and of course it couldn't happen without you.

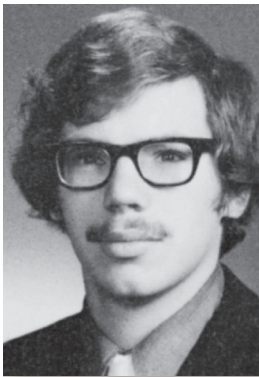

Our recently retired Executive Director, Dr. Judy Siggins, nurtured and stimulated our Foundation, bringing us to new heights in the areas of endowment and campus support. It was my pleasure to be at her side during the end of her tenure. Although Judy will be missed, her leadership included a succession plan that will continue her fine efforts. Cathy Williams, who joined our Foundation in September 2011, was identified by a subcommittee of our board as the ideal candidate to continue Judy's work. Message from the Executive Director

This past year has been one of many changes and successes for the Foundation and for me professionally. I was chosen to succeed Dr. Judy Siggins as the new Executive Director beginning my tenure on April 1, 2013. I am so honored and proud to serve in this new role and appreciate all of the support that I have been given by the Foundation Board of Directors, the staff, campus partners, our alumni and community friends in these past five months. When I came to the Foundation in September of

2011, I was welcomed with open arms and immediately felt as though I was “home.”

I am grateful for the leadership provided to me by Judy Siggins, who mentored me and taught me so much about the organization, the campus and just how important the work that we do is. The Foundation continues to succeed in advancing the College and raising private support to meet student, faculty and capital needs and this year was another banner year for us. We had record financial success (posting revenues of nearly \$4.8 million), excelling on many other fronts – raising additional funding to develop some brand new student scholarships, and critical capital support for our campus infrastructure. As I write this, we are busy packing up our offices to move to a temporary location on campus so that the Darwin R. Wales Administration Building can undergo some critical renovations which will provide for handicapped accessibility and improved HVAC systems for the building – the first stop on campus for almost every visitor. We could not have undertaken these renovations without major gifts from the Clifford & Florence B. Decker Foundation, The Stewart W. and Willma C. Hoyt Foundation, and the The Miller S. and Adelaide Gaffney Foundation.

This is an exciting time for the SUNY Broome Community College campus. By the time you read this, we will have formally opened our newest academic building on campus, The Natural Science Center (NSC) – which is a beautiful facility with cutting-edge technology and brand new lab facilities where our acclaimed faculty will teach and nurture our students. The NSC project would not have been made possible if it weren't for the private support from the George A. and Margaret Mee Charitable Foundation and the Conrad & Virginia Klee Foundation. In June, ground was broken for the new student housing that is scheduled to open on campus in fall of 2014. This transformation from a completely commuter campus is anticipated by so many, and will help the College to continue to increase enrollment and offer even more options for students seeking an affordable and high-quality education.

There were a number of transitions in staffing this past year. In addition to Dr. Siggins' retirement, we bid a fond farewell to

Kay Collins, who retired after dedicating 23 years of exemplary service as our Community Relations Assistant. We also welcomed three new staff members to the Foundation this year; JoAnn Barton, Valerie Pitcher and Andrea Roma. We are proud of the work our staff does, and we were honored to have received the Council for Advancement and Support of Education's (CASE) fundraising award for “Overall Improvement” recognizing our fundraising activities for 2013. On behalf of the Board of Directors and Staff of the Foundation – I would like to offer my sincerest thanks for the support we receive from all of you; our alumni, current and retired faculty and staff, community friends, foundations and corporations. Your generosity helps to invest in the future of our greatest asset – our students!

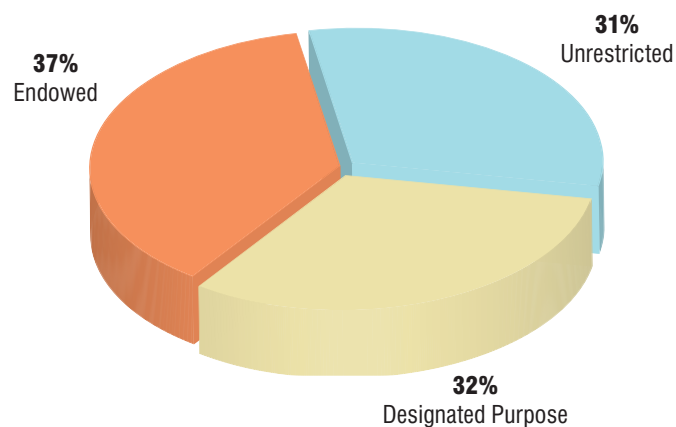

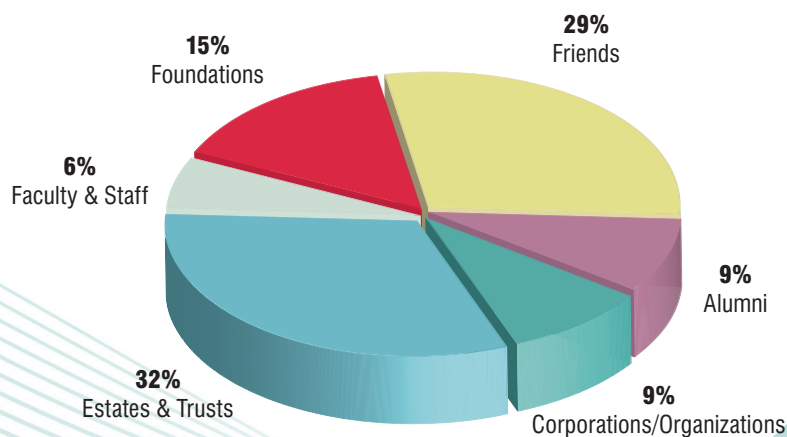
Gifts by Designation

Giving by Constituency



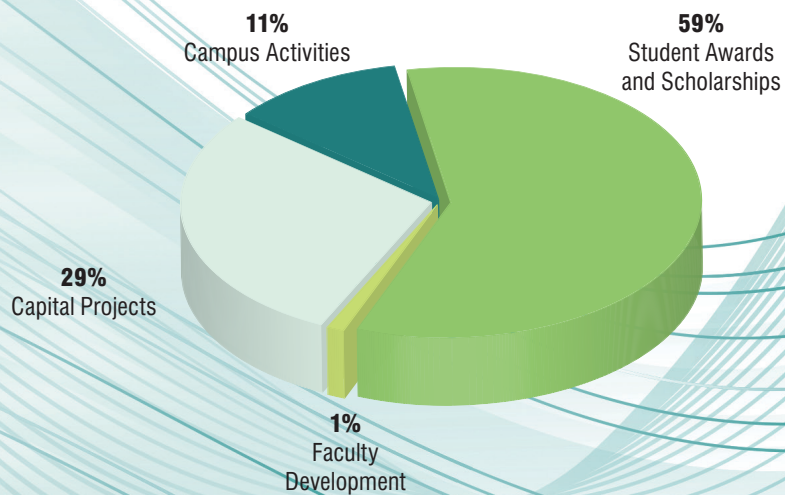

Michael Polesnak visits SUNY Broome

Michael (Mike) Polesnak (BT '69), was just 17 years old when he first stepped on to the Broome Technical Community College campus in 1967. Assisted by a New York State Regents scholarship, which paid his tuition and fees, and the encouragement of his parents, he began his pursuit of a degree in Business Technology.

After graduating from BCC, he attended and graduated from the University at Albany with a BS in Public Accounting in 1971 and served as a Supply Officer in the U.S. Navy from 1971 to 1974. After his discharge from the Navy, he worked as a CPA, for Deloitte & Touche, an international public accounting/professional services firm, in Rochester, NY, Richmond, VA, and Charlotte, NC, for nearly 33 years, until he retired in 2007. Mike and his wife, Susan, continue to live in Charlotte in their retirement.

Mike has included SUNY Broome Community College in his giving and estate plans for several years. He has been an annual donor to the College for over 30 years. Until the past year, Mike indicated that his plans were to bequeath a gift to SUNY Broome in the eventual settlement of his estate. However, in the wake of the nation's high unemployment/slow economic recovery from the 2008 recession, the increased emphasis on education as a vehicle for improving one's chances of gainful employment in a meaningful career, and the importance of the role that community colleges can play in achieving this education/specialized training, he felt compelled to make a difference now – with a transformative and first ever \$100,000

individual alumnus gift. When asked why he chose to make this significant gift at this point in his life he stated, “Higher education – starting with my first two years at BCC – provided me with career and life opportunities my parents never had. More so now than ever, it's time to assist BCC students in achieving this goal.”

Mike's gift establishes a \$100,000 scholarship program at SUNY Broome - ***The Mary (Majewski) and Milton Polesnak Scholarship***. This scholarship honors the memory of his parents who were both very supportive of their children getting a higher education that could provide opportunities they themselves never had as Depression-era children of immigrants. Mike's sister, Pat Chura (SC '70), and brother, John (BT '72), are both graduates of the College. His brother Bill is also a SUNY graduate – from Morrisville State College.

The first Mary (Majewski) and Milton Polesnak Scholarship was awarded in June of 2013 to Charles Licata, a graduating senior from Johnson City High School. The award was presented by Sister Florence Majewski, Mary Polesnak's sister. During the presentation, Sister Florence spoke of how strongly Mary and Milton felt about the importance of gaining access to higher education. Mike Polesnak knows that first-hand, and SUNY Broome students will also have that opportunity for many years to come, thanks to Mike and Susan's generosity.

On a recent trip back to campus, Frank Berrish (BT '66) quickly located his student locker in the second floor hallway of the Wales Administration building. While standing next to the locker, he fondly recalled his time at “Broome Tech” and the impact that the College and his professors made on his life.

At Broome, Frank explored his options and decided that Business was the logical program for him to choose, given that he had worked in his family business; a local motel. Frank was also encouraged to pursue an education in business by his mentor, Dick Stack, who hired Frank at age 16 as an associate at DICK'S Sporting Goods. He continued to work at DICK'S full-time, and at the family motel part-time while attending school. Frank graduated in 1966 with a degree in Business Technology and then went on to earn his Bachelor's Degree in Business Administration from Southeastern University in Washington DC.

Upon returning to Broome County to work in the banking industry, Frank became involved in a number of community projects which focused on strengthening the region economically. In 1965, Frank was given the opportunity to join what was then known as the IBM Credit Union, which had assets of \$25 million, three branches and served only IBM employees and their families. Over the next 37 years, Mr.

Berrish led the organization, now known as Visions Federal Credit Union, with assets of \$3.2 billion and serves 158,000 members in 31 branches throughout Central New York, Rochester, Syracuse, Central Pennsylvania and Northern New Jersey, until his retirement in May of 2013.

Throughout his 37-year career with the credit union, Mr. Berrish selflessly gave back to the community. It was for that reason, that Vision’s Community Gifting Program under Frank’s leadership made a \$100,000 gift to the College in 2013 creating the **Frank E. Berrish Scholarship**. This award honors the work of Mr. Berrish and gives deserving students the opportunity to access a higher education while pursuing a career in financial services. When asked why he chose to support SUNY Broome, Mr. Berrish replied, “My parents were poor and couldn’t afford to send me to college. I had to work, and the educational foundation I received at Broome Community College made a difference for me. So it seemed only natural that I could, and should, give back to students of today and tomorrow.”

Carly (Smith) Nichols (BUFS ’14) was named the first ever Frank E. Berrish Scholar in May of 2013 during the Foundation’s Annual Student Awards event. After Carly graduated from high school, she had the opportunity to attend Roanoke College, a four year institution in Virginia,

but due to pressing circumstances, she had to return home to the Southern Tier before even finishing her first semester. Since that time, Carly had been working at a credit union and had advanced somewhat, but when a great opportunity arose for her to progress in her career, she was passed over for the promotion that instead went to someone who had something she didn’t – a college degree. Without hesitation or feeling sorry herself, she was motivated to return to school to increase her knowledge, marketability, and finally attain something that she had been longing for; a college degree.

Despite her rocky start early in her educational career, she is grateful that she enrolled at SUNY Broome Community College in the fall of 2012 to major in Business Financial Services. “SUNY Broome was the logical choice, I was able to save money, and the ease of the admissions process made me wonder why I didn’t enroll 10 years ago.” SUNY Broome has proven to be the perfect place for Carly. Her academic success in one semester earned her the first ever Visions Federal Credit Union Frank E. Berrish Scholarship.

“Being a non-traditional student I thought I would feel left out, but it is just the opposite here at SUNY Broome. I relate very well to my student peers and there is a great sense of camaraderie among the students and faculty. This scholarship has been a

validation that I am on the right path – and I truly appreciate the opportunity I have been given as a result.” Carly expresses her gratitude about receiving the scholarship, “It is nice to be recognized for all of your hard work, but at the same time it humbles you. When you are an adult, you wonder if anyone ever notices you and your accomplishments, you just go out there and do what you have to and make it work and that is what I have been doing and will continue to do.” Carly credits her strong support from her family and inspiration from her husband Kevin for her success as a student. She is taking a full course-load and maintains a 3.70 GPA. She was recently invited to join the Phi Theta Kappa Honor Society. Along with her studies, Carly is very active with her church and it’s Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA) program. She plans to utilize her degree to further pursue a career in the financial services industry.

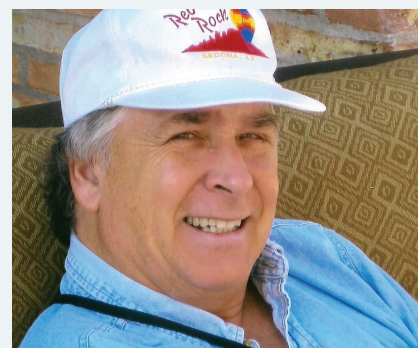

BCC Becomes **SUNY BROOME**

Broome Community College has been renamed SUNY Broome Community College – a new brand designed to put the college in an even stronger position in the academic market place. President Kevin Drumm worked closely with Kor Group, a Boston firm that has worked with dozens of colleges on branding efforts.

“The market research showed that our image in the community is that of a strong, solid academic institution, but, perhaps not the most exciting and fun place to go to college. So our efforts have been focused on rebranding ourselves as a more interesting place to go to school, not just get a solid academic education. We want the best of both worlds,” Drumm said.

After testing potential new names with focus groups, SUNY Broome Community College was chosen as the new official name.

“SUNY has a strong national and international brand,” explained Drumm. “Our primary mission to serve the local community will not change, but you need to have a significant international presence on your campus in the 21st century. We already have that, and using the SUNY brand, which has such strong recognition across the world, is very much a plus when you get out of New York State.”

And while SUNY Broome Community College is set to become the official name on September 26, Drumm says he doesn’t expect community members to stop calling the college BCC right away. And, that’s

just fine with him: BCC is a name that will always connote pride. “One of the reasons we decided not to drop ‘community college’ entirely -- although the trend across the nation has been to do that -- is because BCC is a great brand,” Drumm said.

The new name is being launched at the same time SUNY Broome prepares to become a residential campus for the first time. “Our market position was different in that we were an entirely commuter school compared to our competition,” said Drumm. “Two-thirds of our sister institutions already have residence halls. Twenty years ago this was not an issue. Now that everyone is trying to recruit from other parts of state, country or world, residence halls have the potential to change our position.”

At the end of September, we began to see the marketing office on campus gradually update signage, billboards, letterhead and other marketing materials.

What’s in a name? No matter whether it’s called Broome Tech, Broome Community College or SUNY Broome Community College, Drumm says the College will always be recognized for quality. “Everyone can get in here, but not everyone can get out. You have to do the hard work. We are an excellent institution.”

SUNY BROOME'S NEW RADIO STATION IS ROCKIN' ON-LINE!

A campus milestone was achieved in Spring 2013 with the launch of SUNY Broome's new on-line campus radio station, The HiVE, located in the Communications Department suite in Titchener Hall.

The accomplishment realizes a longstanding vision within the Communications Department and took a sustained effort since the beginning of this year to address technical, programming and staff issues involving the Communications, IT and Marketing and Communications Departments.

"This is a real breakthrough moment for us to launch a working radio station at a college this size," said Professor Jason Detrani, Chairman of the Department of Communications and Media Arts, who oversaw the students and staff who have worked through and solved a complex set of technical and logistical issues to bring The Hive to reality.

The driver behind the effort has been Elijah Weber-Han, a Communications and Media Arts major who spent much of the Spring 2013 semester working through technical issues, recruiting students and organizing the training for the students to become HiVE DJ's. "What is outstanding about The HiVE is, in addition to being able to produce radio shows, the DJ's are learning a variety of skills that will serve them well in the work force," said Weber-Han, the General Manager and Program Director. "Those include organizational skills, planning out a program and self-confidence." The students produced several hours of programming leading up to the station's sign on.

The HiVE brings one more real world media learning platform within reach of students on the SUNY Broome campus. "We are modeling this station after professional radio and it will provide our students with a real world radio station experience," said Ray Scott (LACM '11), General Manager for Engineering. "This is going to be a

great tool for the whole Broome campus. The opportunity with this is huge." Ray, a SUNY Broome Student Ambassador, is back pursuing a degree in Business Information Management.

Tim Skinner (LACM '99), a Communications Instructor who has been training student DJ's for The HiVE, sees tremendous learning possibilities for SUNY Broome students. "What is neat is this is format free. Students have the flexibility to put together programs featuring pop, hip-hop, rock, country western or a blend of different styles. Or they could even produce a radio play," Skinner said.

Professor Detrani recognized the work of several specialists from different departments who helped overcome the many obstacles to putting The HiVE on line. "Silvia Briga (LACM '07), Matt Pisani (ET '08), Chris Keaty (LACM '08) and IT's Furman Romero (LACM '06) were among the staff members who contributed extra

hours, efforts and expertise to make this happen," Detrani said.

Weber-Han explained that during the Spring 2013 semester a dedicated group of students met regularly for training. The meetings covered Federal Communications Commission rules and regulations, techniques on announcing and show structure.

Tim Skinner ran 'How to be a Better DJ' workshops for students. "We taught them how to put their own shows together. And we will continue to train DJ's throughout the year," Weber-Han said.

"The HiVE is a College asset, not just an asset of the Communications Department. We are actively seeking students and even faculty who are interested in creating radio programming," Detrani added.

SPORTS MANAGEMENT DEGREE NOW OFFERED AT SUNY BROOME



Students at SUNY Broome Community College can now earn a degree in Sports Management. The associate's in science degree was recently approved by the

State University of New York (SUNY).

Although not a sports buff himself, Business Chair Rick Behr (BM '79) spearheaded the proposal and submitted it for approval last January. "There were so many students who kept asking me about having a sports management program, so I took the hint. There is a strong interest on campus and I expect this to quickly become very popular," he said.

The field of sports management is broad, and includes jobs related to the business, marketing, finance and management of professional, semiprofessional and college sports teams.

"These jobs are typically related to accounting, promotion, advertising and event management," said Behr. "You can go on to get a master's and doctorate in this as well." According to Behr, the job outlook in sports management is promising. "We looked on many job sites and there are a lot of jobs. Retail and manufacturing companies like DICK'S or Reebok fall under this umbrella too."

The program at SUNY Broome is designed for students to transfer to four-year sports management programs, including some schools in close proximity to the college. "We worked closely with SUNY Cortland on setting the program up, so we will probably have a transfer agreement with them quickly now that the program has been approved by SUNY," explained Behr.

Behr was pleased that getting the program up and running was easy and cost effective. "We already had the expertise there. Our Director of Athletics, Brett Carter, who, has a degree

in Sports Management, and some very skilled people from across the region are being gathered together to form a strong instruction team. We were lucky because it was easy for us to do."

Coursework will be initially offered during the day, but evening and weekend courses may be added down the road. Behr expects more than 100 students to be enrolled by spring 2014.
